SPECIAL REPORT:

OPERATION MEDICAL'S WAREHOUSE COMMITTEE'S CRITICAL SUPPORT OF OUR MISSION TRIPS

Logistics play a key role in organizing a Mission Trip, and the hub of logistics for Operation Medical is our warehouse and the team of volunteers who run it. Once a Mission Trip is decided upon, and a Mission Leader is selected, work begins for the Warehouse Committee Volunteers.

Counting and sorting supplies for up to three Mission Trips in a given year is an ongoing task for our Warehouse Volunteers. As basic supplies become available, they are organized for the upcoming trips and inventory lists are compiled. The Warehouse Volunteers need to know approximately how many and what types of surgeries are anticipated for each Mission Trip and they reach out to the surgeons who will be on the Mission Trip to determine their special needs such as sutures, instruments, and specialized medical supplies. Much of what is packed for the mission team depends on the surgical specialty and equipment the hospitals have available such as laparoscopic equipment, harmonic scalpels, cautery devices and anesthesia machines.

Once details are fine-tuned, the Warehouse team begins sourcing needed supplies. This is accomplished by reviewing on-hand items in Operation Medical's Harrisburg warehouse and making contact with local hospitals, medical suppliers and other non-profits such as Americares – a health-focused relief organization. Supplies are either donated to or purchased by Operation Medical.

Once all of the necessary supplies are received at the warehouse the packing process begins. Each participating mission volunteer residing close to the Harrisburg warehouse is required to carry a medical bag along with their personal checked bag. Each bag is carefully packed and padded to prevent breakage or damage and a detailed inventory sheet is provided for customs. Bags are numbered and cataloged. All information regarding each bag and its content is entered into an Excel spreadsheet which can then be sorted by item, bag number and individual carrier.

Warehouse Committee Volunteers also meet at other times to sort, inventory, and organize supplies. They spend many hours outside the warehouse searching for and ordering supplies, sterilizing supplies, communicating with trip participants, calculating needed supplies for trips based on surgeon specialty and number of cases, creating spread sheets for physician/nurse preferences and guidelines on packing anesthesia and operating room supplies, creating lists of supplies in each medical bag, tracking bags going to mission and returning, writing reports, and tracking volunteer hours on a yearly basis.

Operation Medical is grateful for their generosity as well as that of HERSHA Corporation which donates warehouse space to Operation Medical.
