

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

his past fiscal year has brought many exciting events for Operation Medical, I'd like to share with you some of our recent activities, future plans, and most importantly, to express my appreciation to our past. current, and future volunteers who are poised and ready to carry on our mission.


This past fiscal year, we completed our 19th and 20th medical-surgical missions - one to Lilongwe, Malawi (September 2024) and another to Surat, Gujarat (January 2025). Together, our volunteer teams performed 145 life-changing surgical procedures for individuals who otherwise would not have had access to this critical care.

Equally important, we placed a strong emphasis on training and education. While training can slow down the number of procedures completed during a mission week, it provides long-lasting benefits by empowering local medical teams to continue performing these surgeries long after we return home.

Our impact extended beyond international missions. In April 2025, we hosted a Volunteer Appreciation event, celebrating our 200+ dedicated volunteers who have made 20 missions possible. Eight of the volunteers have each served on ten or more of our missions and were recognized for their incredible levels of service. They are Dr. Kenneth & Cheryl Arthur, Dr. Parul Krishnamurthy Iver, Sue Miller, Drs. Mukul & Neelima Parikh, Dr. Bipin Patel, and Bonnie Peffer.

Locally, our volunteers connected with the community by hosting a table at the India Day Fair at Harrisburg Area Community College (HACC). This was a meaningful opportunity to engage with the local Indian community -

a group that has supported Operation Medical since our founding in 2013. These outreach efforts, combined with our social media and other engagement initiatives are critical for building the next generation of volun-

teers and supporters. As some of our founding members move toward retirement, we are inspired to see new faces stepping forward to carry our mission into the future. This past year, we were proud to welcome two new Board Members and twelve new mission volunteers.

Looking ahead, we have two missions confirmed for this current fiscal year. At the time of our Annual Report going to print, our volunteer team is currently in Malawi, this time partnering with Kabudula Community Hospital, a smaller, regional facility eager for support and training. In early 2026, we will return to Dharampur, India, where we see great potential for an ongoing partnership with local teams, especially in education and surgical training.

It is only because of your support and generosity that we are able to carry on this important mission promoting and providing high quality medical care and education to communities that otherwise do not have adequate access.


insights gained by frequent volunteers and assist prospects considering mission trips to ask questions while they contemplate signing on.


recovering in the postoperative area, demonstrated respiratory stress and our team's quick thinking and skills saved his life. The Op Med team had not

been involved in his care to that point, but our recovery nurse, Emily Knight, immediately recognized his trouble, called for help, and got the situation under control. Lindsay Devers and Ben Segil both immediately joined in and helped establish the airway and a way to safely get him the critical care he needed. The whole team dropped everything and rapidly intervened to save a life. So impressive!"

Operation Medical is Going Back to Dharampur in January 2026

Operation Medical is sending a team of volunteers back to Shrimad Rajchandra Hospital where we conducted a previous mission in January of 2024.



The hospital is in Dharampur, approximately 215 kilometers from Mumbai. This 250-bed facility stands as a testament to compassionate care and medical excellence in rural India. The hospital maintains its mission to provide high-quality

healthcare free of cost or at highly subsidized rates to the underprivileged tribal communities of South Gujarat. Their mission provides the basis for a truly synergistic relationship with Operation Medical.

Our collaboration with the hospital allows us to bring medical care to those in dire need, bridging the gap between global quality healthcare and local accessibility.

Once again, our hosts are providing lodging for the team at Shrimad Rajachandra Ashram-Dharampur, a spiritual sanctuary for seekers from all walks of

Operation Medical Returns to Lilongwe, Malawi This November

Location: Kabudula Community Hospital (KCH) **Focus:** Plastic and General Surgery Operation Medical is partnering once again with Access Health Africa (AHA), to conduct a surgical mission trip - this time to a small, rural hospital. We previously conducted missions with AHA in 2014 and 2024.

We are grateful for the support of AHA, which is well-known and trusted in the Malawian community. Having had a presence in the area for over 20 years, AHA started as an educational group and evolved into a medical/surgical coordination group. They provide a significant amount of support to us during the mission, such as assistance with lodging, transportation, and meals, as well as temporary licensing support and interpreters.

The 2025 team has been selected and is comprised

of a Plastic Surgeon, a General Surgeon, a Physicians' Assistant, an Anesthesiologist and CRNA, Surgical Techs, Nurses, Non-Clinical Support Staff, and a Photographer. They will be housed at the Access Health Africa house, located in Area 3 of Lilongwe, Malawi. The

hospital is about a 45–60-minute drive from the house, and the AHA team will assist us with the daily transportation needs.





Malawi Health Care Facts:

- Less than 13% of the government's budget is allocated to healthcare, resulting in a shortage of healthcare professionals, adequate facilities, and quality care.
- There is one surgeon per 1,000,000 Malawians, resulting in patients waiting weeks, months, and even years to receive the care they need.
- Over 45,000 Malawians receive surgeries every year from people who are not trained in surgery, much less certified surgeons.

FINANCIAL REPORT AND FUNDING NEEDS

Operation Medical ended the fiscal year with a positive change in net assets of \$19,925. Donation revenue slightly exceeded our \$95,000 budget, and on the expense side, we benefited greatly from a generous in-kind donation of medical supplies for our missions. This gift eliminated the need to purchase budgeted supplies, saving the organization \$22,000. We are grateful to partner organizations such as Americares and Gore Medical Products, for their support of our work.

Administrative expenses were held to \$38,886, reflecting our commitment to careful, efficient business practices. These costs support critical activities such as mission trip planning and preparation, volunteer recruitment, visa and medical license processing, and committee operations. We are proud to report that 89.5% of total expenses directly supported our mission, with just 10.5% allocated to administration.

Two important points are highlighted in the accompanying charts:

- *Volunteer travel costs:* Total travel expenses for mission trips were \$85,857, of which \$82,424 was paid directly by volunteer doctors, nurses, and support staff. Operation Medical contributed approximately \$3,400 to help offset these costs.
- In-kind contributions and services: Valued at \$155,601, these reflect the professional medical services provided at mission sites, as well as unreimbursed volunteer costs for visas, medical supplies, and incidentals. Service values are calculated using nationally recognized data from Medscape and NursingJournal.org.
